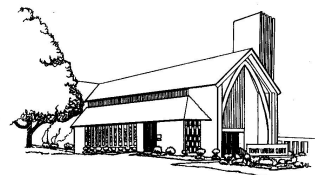

This hymn was written by Elisabeth Kreuziger (c1500-1535). She was married to Kaspar Kreuziger, a student at Wittenberg and one of Martin Luther's most devoted pupils. In 1528 he became professor of theology there. Elisabeth, a friend of Luther's wife Katharina, is known as the first poetess of the Lutheran movement.

Elisabeth based her hymn on the Christmas hymn of Aurelius Prudentius (348-413), which we know as "Of the Father's Love Begotten." It is ELW 295. Bach used Elisabeth's hymn in cantatas 22, 96, 132 and 164.

The melody is derived from a mid-15th-century secular love song. It was published with Kreuziger's text in the Erfurt ENCHIRIDON of 1524, one of the first Lutheran hymn collections.

This arrangement uses settings by Melchior Vulpius (ca. 1570-1615) and Johann Walter (1496-1570).

THE STORY, CHAPTER 14

¹Rehoboam went to Shechem, for all Israel had gone there to make him king. ²When Jeroboam son of Nebat heard this (he was still in Egypt, where he had fled from King Solomon), he returned from Egypt. ³So they sent for Jeroboam, and he and the whole assembly of Israel went to Rehoboam and said to him: ⁴"Your father put a heavy yoke on us, but now lighten the harsh labor and the heavy yoke he put on us, and we will serve you."

⁵Rehoboam answered, "Go away for three days and then come back to me." So the people went away.

⁶Then King Rehoboam consulted the elders who had served his father Solomon during his lifetime. "How would you advise me to answer these people?" he asked. ⁷They replied, "If today you will be a servant to these people and serve them and give them a favorable answer, they will always be your servants." ⁸But Rehoboam rejected the advice the elders gave him and consulted the young men who had grown up with him and were serving him. ⁹He asked them, "What is your advice? How should we answer these people who say to me, 'Lighten the yoke your father put on us'?" ¹⁰The young men who had grown up with him replied, "These people have said to you, 'Your father put a heavy yoke on us, but make our yoke lighter.' Now tell them, 'My little finger is thicker than my father's waist. ¹¹My father laid on you a heavy yoke; I will make it even heavier. My father scourged you with whips; I will scourge you with scorpions.'"

¹²Three days later Jeroboam and all the people returned to Rehoboam, as the king had said, "Come back to me in three days." ¹³The king answered the people harshly. Rejecting the advice given him by the elders, ¹⁴he followed the advice of the young men and said, "My father made your yoke heavy; I will make it even heavier. My father scourged you with whips; I will scourge you with scorpions." ¹⁵So the king did not listen to the people, for this turn of events was from the LORD, to fulfill the word the LORD had spoken to Jeroboam son of

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." ³Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." ⁴Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied — ⁷altogether there were about twelve of them.

***WHAT WE BELIEVE: BAPTISM** - adapted from Luther's *Small Catechism*
(*For the complete text, see pages 1164-1165 of this hymnal.*)

In today's Gospel we heard of Jesus' baptism by John in the Jordan River.
What is baptism and what does this mean for us?

Baptism is not simply plain water.

Instead, it is water

**used according to God's command
and connected with God's Word.**

What then is this word of God?

**Where our Lord Christ says in Matthew 28,
"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,
baptizing them in the name of the Father
and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."**

What gifts or benefits does baptism grant?

**It brings about forgiveness of sins,
redeems from death and the devil,
and gives eternal salvation
to all who believe it,**

as the words and promise of God declare.

How can water do such great things?

**Clearly the water does not do it,
but the word of God,
which is with and alongside the water,
and faith,
which trusts this word of God in the water.**

What then is the significance of such a baptism with water?

**It signifies that the old person in us
with all sins and evil desires
is to be drowned
and die through daily sorrow for sin
and through repentance,
and on the other hand
that daily a new person
is to come forth and rise up
to live before God
in righteousness and purity forever.**

Where is this written?

**St. Paul says in Romans 6,
“We have been buried with Christ
by baptism into death,
so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead
by the glory of the Father,
so we too might walk in newness of life.”**

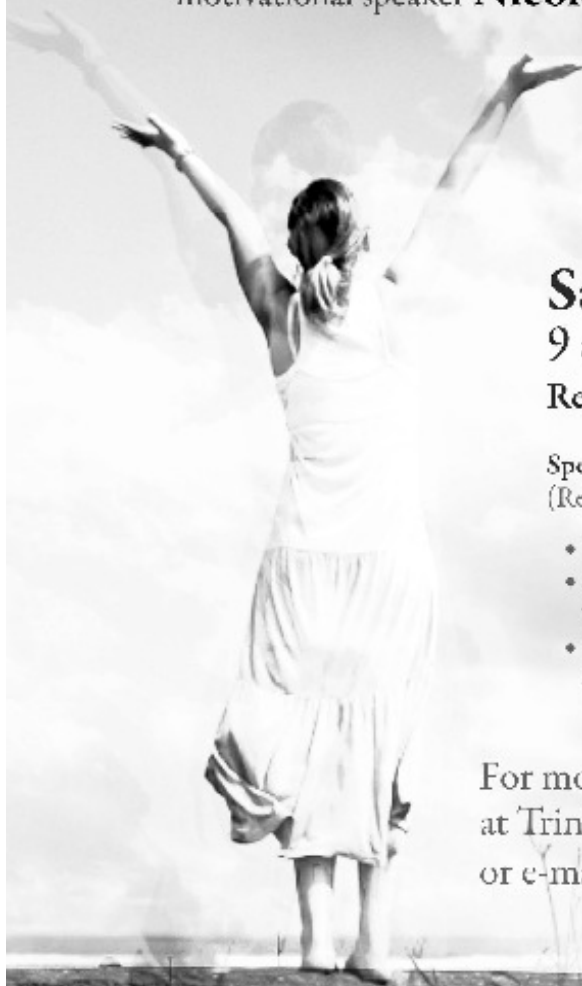
