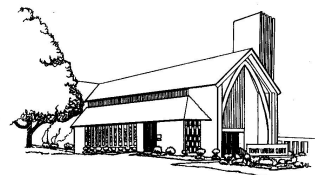

**READING** *Selected Verses from Amos and Hosea*

**THE STORY, CHAPTER 15**

**Amos**

<sup>3:1</sup>Hear this word, people of Israel, the word the LORD has spoken against you—against the whole family I brought up out of Egypt:

<sup>2</sup>“You only have I chosen  
of all the families of the earth;  
therefore I will punish you  
for all your sins.”

<sup>11</sup>Therefore this is what the Sovereign LORD says:  
“An enemy will overrun your land,  
pull down your strongholds  
and plunder your fortresses.”

<sup>4:2</sup>“The time will surely come  
when you will be taken away with hooks,  
the last of you with fishhooks.

<sup>3</sup>You will each go straight out  
through breaches in the wall,  
and you will be cast out toward Harmon,”  
declares the LORD.

and lack of bread in every town,  
yet you have not returned to me,”

Then the LORD God Almighty will be with you,  
just as you say he is.

<sup>15</sup>Hate evil, love good;  
maintain justice in the courts.  
Perhaps the LORD God Almighty will have mercy  
on the remnant of Joseph.

## Hosea

<sup>4:1</sup>Hear the word of the LORD, you Israelites,

no acknowledgment of God in the land.

<sup>2</sup>There is only cursing, lying and murder,  
stealing and adultery;  
they break all bounds,  
and bloodshed follows bloodshed.

<sup>5:4</sup>“Their deeds do not permit them  
to return to their God.

A spirit of prostitution is in their heart;  
they do not acknowledge the LORD.

<sup>7</sup>They are unfaithful to the LORD;  
they give birth to illegitimate children.  
When they celebrate their New Moon feasts,  
he will devour their fields.

<sup>14</sup>For I will be like a lion to Ephraim,  
like a great lion to Judah.  
I will tear them to pieces and go away;  
I will carry them off, with no one to rescue them.

<sup>15</sup>Then I will return to my lair  
until they have borne their guilt  
and seek my face—  
in their misery  
they will earnestly seek me.”

<sup>8:13</sup> <sup>b</sup>Now he will remember their wickedness  
and punish their sins:

They will return to Egypt.

<sup>14</sup>Israel has forgotten their Maker  
and built palaces;

Judah has fortified many towns.  
But I will send fire on their cities  
that will consume their fortresses.”

<sup>9:7</sup>The days of punishment are coming,  
the days of reckoning are at hand.  
Let Israel know this.

Because your sins are so many  
and your hostility so great,  
the prophet is considered a fool,  
the inspired person a maniac.
